In the spirit of our new name, **Cerba Lancet Rwanda**, and in celebration of our **10th anniversary**, we conducted our first CSR activity outside Kigali on **February 18th, 2026**, at the **Ubumwe Community Center, RUBAVU DISTRICT, WESTERN PROVINCE**.

#### ABOUT UBUMWE COMMUNITY CENTER



Founded in 2005, Ubumwe Community Center is a leading local NGO with three branches: Rubavu (HQ), Bugesera, and Musanze, providing care and empowerment for persons with disabilities.

The center serves 1,228 individuals with disabilities, many of whom face mental health challenges and lack family acceptance. Their team of 92 staff members runs multiple programs tailored to diverse needs



Additionally, the center conducts **Community-Based Rehabilitation (CBR)** in remote areas for persons over 50 years, providing essential on-site **health services** such as **physiotherapy** and **medical guidance**.


HYGIENE MATERIALS TO PROMOTE HYGIENE AND WELLBEING IN THE COMMUNITY.
